Let us go forth in the name of Christ!



This is the First Sunday of the season of Advent – the time to prepare for the great Mystery of Christmas. The color for this season is BLUE.

Write or draw below all the things you see which are BLUE.

Our Sunday Worship – the Holy Eucharist – has a pattern that is the same each week. The first part is the time when God’s people are **COMING TOGETHER**, the second is **LISTENING AND LEARNING**, and the third is **PRAYING AND SHARING**. We began **THE HOLY COMMUNION** with the OFFERING, the GREAT THANKSGIVING, then the SANCTUS. Next is the **PRAYER OF CONSECRATION**.

The word “consecration” means to “make holy”. This prayer gives thanks for all God’s gifts and the priest talks to God for all of us. We thank God for making the world and us, for loving us even when we disobey, for sending us Jesus, for all Jesus did for us, and his last supper with the disciples.

Together, we remember Jesus, and he is with us, just as he promised. We remember that he died and rose again. We know he will come again, as he promised.

We ask God to take our bread and wine and make them into the holy food of Jesus’ body, as he promised, so that we can be his holy people.
