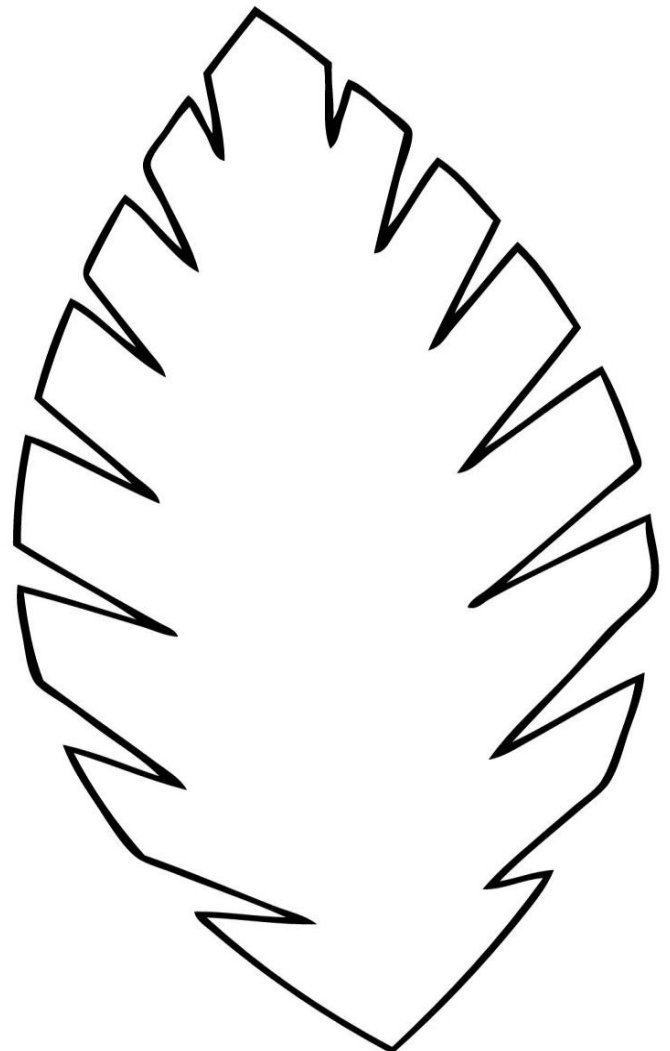

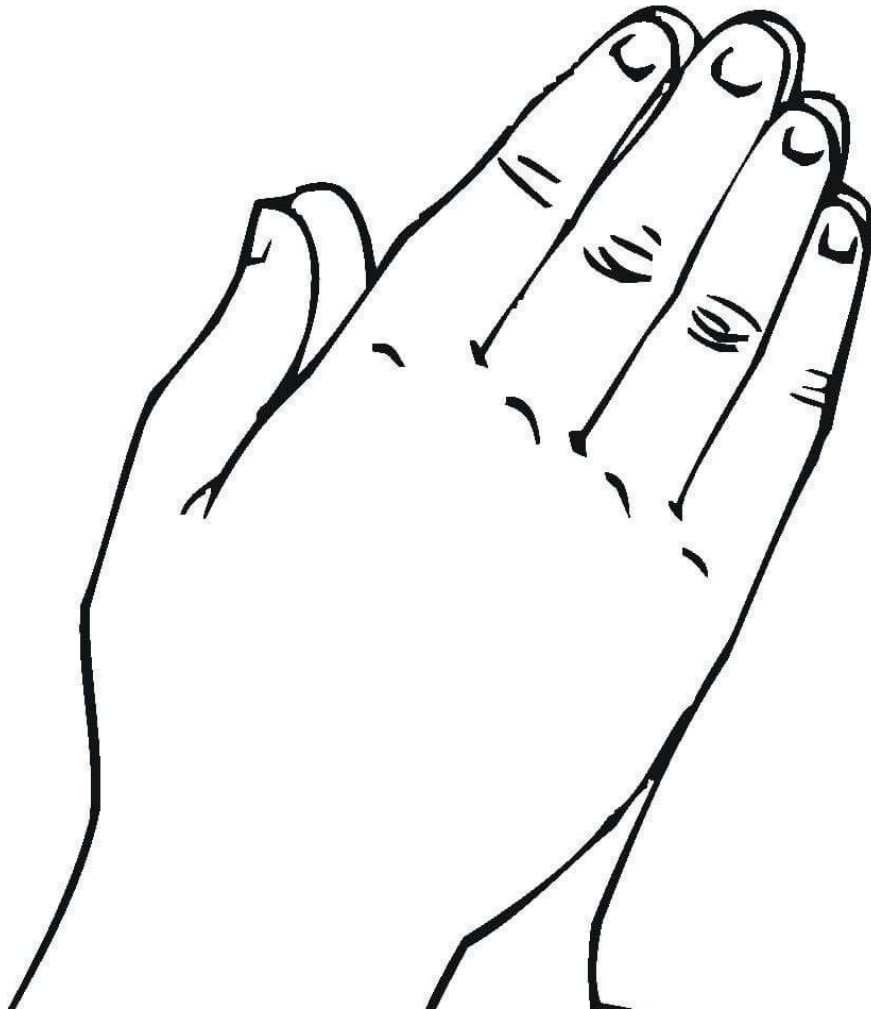
As Jesus entered Jerusalem for the last time, the people shouted praises for all the wonderful things that Jesus had done. If you were in that crowd, what would you want to praise Jesus for? What do you think you might say or shout as he rode by? Draw or write in the palm leaf below.



One of the readings from the Bible today is about Jesus praying in the garden. Jesus tells his disciples to pray, then he goes away from them to pray alone at the Mount of Olives. Just like Jesus, we can pray when we are all alone or with our family or friends. We can also ask our friends and others to pray.

Prayer is simply talking to God and listening for God to speak to our hearts. Try not to think of prayer as a chore. Think of prayer as a fun activity because, at any time of day or night, you can stop and say “Hi, God!” or, “I had so much fun today, God.” We can even say, “God, I feel sad today, please help me to feel better.” God loves us and God is always listening.
