Each week we sing or say a PSALM together. The PSALMS are poems in the OLD TESTAMENT. They help us to say what we feel about God. Psalm 81:1 says, “Sing with joy to God our strength and raise a loud shout to the God of Jacog.”

Our Sunday Worship – the Holy Eucharist – has a pattern that is the same each week. The first part is the time when God’s people are **COMING TOGETHER**:

Last week we looked at the first 4 parts. Next, we sit down and listen to the **Bible Lessons**. After readings from the OLD TESTAMENT and the PSALMS, we hear a **NEW TESTAMENT LESSON from an EPISTLE**. Epistle means letter. Today’s Epistle was written to the Hebrews (Jewish Christians.)

**Hebrews 13:1 says, “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday today and forever.”**  
(This is one you might want to highlight in your own Bible.)
